Nordic Impact Assessment Day - Effectiveness, experiences and practical tools

Monday 22nd of May 2006, Stavanger, Room Runde at the IAIA Conference Venue, 10:00 – 17:15

In relation to Impact Assessment (IA) issues close co-operation between the Nordic countries has been evident since the beginning of the 1990s. Formally this co-operation was initially co-ordinated by the Nordic *ad hoc* group of IA, though, since 1999, this task has been carried out by Nordregio. This co-operation is manifested in Nordic IA conferences held every second or third year. Since the IAIA '06 conference is to be held in Norway, where the 6th Nordic IA Conference also was sited, it was decided to replace the Nordic conference with a 'Nordic Day' and several other Nordic inputs included in the IAIA '06 Conference.

The aim of the Nordic IA Day '06 is to look at emerging issues in the IA field, to scrutinize IA cases and present new practitioner tools in a Nordic context. An international IA expert will also be on hand to give perspective to the IA development in the Nordic countries. Special focus will be placed on the issue and concept of effectiveness in relation to IA implementation, that is to say, the relationship between the expected outputs of IA implementation and the actual experienced output – in both the short and long run.

The programme is open for every-one interested in the Nordic perspectives of IA and the programme will be held in English.
