IAIA Global Environment Award

Awarded to a leading individual or institution that has made a substantial contribution to the practice of environmental assessment, management or policy on a global scale, or has otherwise made a major contribution to promoting environmental sustainability or environmental justice. Particular emphasis is given to recognizing efforts in promoting impact assessment for improvement of the global environment. This award was given for the first time in 2001 to Maurice Strong, to Jan Pronk in 2002, to Mostafa Kamal Tolba in 2003 and this year to Margöt Wallstrom.

Corporate Award

Made to a private sector corporation in recognition of contribution to developments in impact assessment, or to excellence in practice. Strong preference is given to recognizing the contributions of larger organizations and for the whole of corporation operation rather than for a specific project. Recent winners have included African Development Bank, Gas Trans Boliviano S.A. (GTB) and Transportadora Brasileira Gasoduto Bolivia-Brasil S.A. (TBG) and Shell International Exploration and Development.

Institutional Award

Made to a national or international governmental or non-governmental organization for contribution to impact assessment such as for a significant contribution to the practice of impact assessment, or for setting regulatory standards, or other environment related activity deserving recognition. Recent winners include the Southern African Institute for Environmental Assessment, IIED – International Institute for Environment Development and the World Commission on Dams.

Individual Award

Made to an individual, not necessarily a member of IAIA, to recognize personal contribution to the discipline of impact assessment such as by theoretical contribution, best practice, etc. The award is meant to reflect major achievement over a period of time and on the international level, however it could be within a narrow sub-field of impact assessment. The winner is likely to be a mid career professional, rather than an early or end-of-career individual. The 2004 winner is Rob Verheem for his contribution to the development of Strategic Environmental Assessment.

Rose-Hulman Award

The Rose-Hulman is IAIA's premier contribution award and is awarded to an individual for major contribution to the field of impact assessment over a sustained period at an international level. The recipient must be a present or past member of IAIA. Contribution to the field is broadly defined, and could include leadership in an organization promoting impact assessment (such as IAIA), and/or contribution to the understanding of (through scholarship and research), or practice of, impact assessment. The contribution could also be for excellence or leadership in training in impact assessment over a lengthy period. The award is meant to reflect sustained service to the field, rather than to reflect a specific achievement. Recent winners have included Jean-Roger Mercier, Chris Wood and Shirley Conover.

Regional Award

Awarded to a person or organization that has made a substantial contribution to the field of impact assessment and/or has taken a leadership role in promoting best practice in impact assessment within the general world region of the location of the conference for that year. There would normally be only one award each year, and the award does not need to be awarded every year. Recent winners include Tunisia International Centre for Environmental Technologies (CITET), Juan Quintero and the Chinese University of Hong Kong.
