# **SEA good practice elements and performance criteria**

- Firstly introduced around mid 1990s
- **Terminology used varys, for example:** 
  - basic elements for effective SEA,
  - SEA good practice elements,
  - basic principles of SEA,
  - conditions of effectiveness for SEA,
  - principles for SEA,
  - factors for SEA effectiveness,
  - SEA performance criteria.
- Elements/criteria have broad scope: assessment process, overall decision-making context, planning system



# Methodology: content analysis ...

- Screening of 45 SEA related published documents
- □ Identification of frequency and nature with which authors representing different countries and systems contributed to international SEA debate (e.g. Identification of SEA elements/criteria)

### Findings 1 ...


■ Number of books published by the country an author is based in:



- 33% of international SEA literature comes from UKbased authors
- No authors from Italy

### Findings 2 ...


Number of SEA case studies per country described in the international SEA literature:



- Total of 243 case studies were identified.
- UK and NL make up 47% of all cases
- Italian cases represent 2% of all case-studies (these were part of EU research projects)

### Findings 3 ...

Number of SEA systems considered in SEA publications



- UK is country most analysed 14%, followed by NL (13%), EC (10%), US (8%), Dev. Banks (8%), CND (7%) and NZ (6%).
- Italy scored zero.

#### Case study: Italy ...

- **☐** Why Italy:
  - Contribution to international SEA literature
  - Integration of environmental aspects in planning system and traditions
  - EA performances

#### Case study: Italy ...

- Testing Italy's performances against 4 aspects which resulted to be of key importance from the review of SEA good practice elements/performance criteria:
  - 1. Existence of sustainability and environmental objectives and their implementation through PPPs
  - 2. Existence of an established institutional framework (including effective EIA system)
  - **3.** Flexibility and adaptiveness
  - Public participation.

#### Conclusions ...

- SEA good practice elements and performance criteria have been developed based on practices and experiences of a selected number of countries
- SEA good practice elements and performance criteria may not be fully valid in all SEA systems
  - Certain elements might act in counterproductive manner (e.g. flexibility and adaptability for Italy)
- System's specific SEA elements need to be identified.
