
BACKGROUND

- A Ministerial Statement on political commitment on EIA
- 2. Regional and sub-regional consultations, initiatives and development of African Stakeholders Action Plan for EA Capacity Building
- Follow up Actions to be undertaken at national, sub-regional and Africa regional level
- 3. Regional Programmes and National Frameworks for Establishment of EA&M
- Address sub-regional and national issues, provide linkages with other initiatives, support local capacity



EA&M: PROGRESS SO FAR

- 1. Environmental Management Institutions in ALMOST ALL countries of Africa
- Political commitment on EA&M; legislation; initiative in capacity building.
- 2. Concept of Sustainable Development
- High Political support and initiatives such as NEPAD, Africa Convention on Management of Natural Resources
- 3. Networks of EA&M professionals
- Support information exchange in EA&M
- 4. Private Sector development and interest in EA&M

CHALLENGES

- 1. Slow Pace of Development of Environmental Institutions
- Lack of adequate governance mechanisms, awareness
- 2. Ever Increasing Demands
- New development Initiatives, donor requirements, more complex environmental issues, demands from articulate civil society
- 3. Inadequate Capacity
